The Heart of the Matter

The seven bowl judgments lead to the final, cataclysmic clash between Christ and Satan. In them we are able to see the inevitability of the Lord's victory and the progressive, methodical nature of His wrath. Even as He carries out justice, He provides ample opportunity for repentance. But those who suffer through the plagues refuse to repent.



Discovering the Way

1. First Four Super Bowls of Judgment: The Natural Realm (Revelation 16:1–9)

Directed against the natural world, the first four bowls of judgment are designed to seize the attention of all people and prepare them to understand the purpose of the supernatural afflictions that follow. Nevertheless, the people refuse to repent.

2. Next Two Super Bowls of Judgment: The Ruler's Domain (Revelation 16:10–16)

The fifth and sixth bowl judgments target the Antichrist and his center of authority. And even though the plagues continue, the people grow more and more rebellious.

3. Last Super Bowl of Judgment: The Entire World (Revelation 16:17–21)

As the kingdoms of the earth gather to fight the Battle of Armageddon, the seventh angel will pour out the contents of the final bowl, marking the cataclysmic end of the world.



Starting Your Journey

Rest assured, those who mistreat the innocent and choose evil over good will be brought into account. And they will face judgment without excuse. John's warning can be distilled into two key truths to remember:


1. Escaping the reality of God's judgment is impossible.
2. Postponing repentance is regrettable.




